



# Parts of the Bow






# Left Hand Fingerings






# **Rest Positions**

- Stand and place the instrument in rest position under your right elbow.
- Place your left hand on the upper bout of the instrument under the neck.
- Face the bridge out, away from your body.
- Sit near the front of the chair with your feet flat on the floor.

# **Creative Tools of Music**

Pizzicato (pizz.)—pluck the string

## **Pizzicato Position**

As you look down the instrument, from left to right, the strings are:

G
D
A
E
low
high






## **Left Hand Playing Position**





### **Bow Hold on Pencil**





- Hold out your right hand, palm up, with fingers curving inward in a relaxed manner.
- Touch the end of your thumbnail to the outer joint of your second finger, not the tip of the finger.
- Place the pencil between the thumb and second finger.
- Turn your pencil so it lies between the middle and outer joint of the first finger and on the tip of the fourth finger.
- Make sure your thumb is bent outward!



## **Bow Hold on Bow**







Make sure your thumb contacts the stick between the winding and the frog.

## Naming The Spaces And Lines Of The Staff




The staff has 4 spaces. The spaces are  $\underline{F} \underline{A} \underline{C} \underline{E}$ .



The staff has 5 lines. The lines are E G B D F.

#### LESSON 2

#### Pluck The Open Strings



Look down at your bridge while holding your **violin**. Memorize the names of the strings as you pluck them one at a time.

Say: "EADGGDAE".



Repeat this exercise several times.

#### Pizzicato The Open Strings

- is a quarter note. A quarter note receives 1 beat.
- is a whole rest. It receives 4 beats.




- 1. PIZZICATO the first time through.




Quarter Note: Green Half Note: Light Blue Whole Note: Orange Quarter Rest: Dark Gray


**About This Activity**
